100 years ago the Spanish flu pandemic killed millions of people worldwide and thousands of people here in Ohio. In response, Ohio created local health departments in 1919. In the last 100 years Lorain County Public Health has served the residents of Lorain County and made a positive impact on the health and well-being of the community.

According to the CDC, advances in public health from this past century added 25 years to the average lifespan in the United States. There have been many changes over the last 100 years, but the need for strong public health departments is as important as ever.

In 1918, the Spanish flu pandemic killed 675,000 people in the United States.



In 2018, LCPH nurses administered 8,976 doses of vaccine to prevent vaccine-preventable diseases, including the flu. In 1918, there were no comprehensive food safety laws to protect people from foodborne illness.





In 2018, LCPH sanitarians conducted 3,871 food safety inspections using statewide laws and regulations to reduce the risk of foodborne illness in Lorain County.

In 2018, less than 1% of infants died before their first birthday in all of Lorain County.

Ways we're helping to prevent modern causes of death:



Safer roads for everyone to walk, bike, roll, and drive addresses unintentional injury, heart disease, Alzheimer's, stroke, and diabetes.

In 2018, LCPH worked with leaders to secure over \$650,000 in grants to increase active transportation and prevent traffic injuries.



Walking can reduce the risk of heart disease, Alzheimer's, stroke, diabetes, and some cancers.

LCPH works with schools and other leaders to open up spaces for community walking, which helps residents stay active and healthy. In 2018, LCPH coordinated 6 indoor walking locations.



Monitoring and managing blood pressure can help prevent heart disease and stroke.

LCPH worked with Lorain County libraries in 2018 so that patrons can borrow blood pressure monitors. Checking blood pressure can help people work with their doctor to prevent chronic disease.
