

2019 Top local causes of death > and some examples of what LCPH

is doing about them



LCPH administered 486 vaccines against human papillomavirus, also known as HPV. HPV can cause cervical cancer, throat cancer, and other cancers.

Heart disease - 595 deaths

> LCPH helped local child care facilities pass 2 healthy eating policies and 2 healthy menu changes to help start healthy habits in young ones.

Chronic lower respiratory disease - 220 deaths

LCPH passed a policy to make



Accidents - 184 deaths

LCPH helped put on the Zero Proof Mix Off, an event that encouraged over 600 people to practice sober driving and offer nonalcoholic options at parties.

Stroke - 168 deaths

Blood pressure self-monitoring became easier when LCPH provided blood pressure monitors to 14 Lorain County libraries. Blood pressure management helps reduce the risk of stroke.

Decrease in tobacco use

In 2015, 22% of Lorain County residents self-reported as a current smoker. In 2019, only 12% of Lorain County residents self-reported as a current smoker. Quitting tobacco reduces the risk for heart disease, stroke, and some cancers. In 2019, LCPH...

- Secured over \$120,000 to help continue this trend.
- > Reached over 14,600 people on Facebook about e-cigarette use among youth.
- > Conducted 53 store audits of local tobacco retailers, who are doing a great job following the new Tobacco 21 law (which raises the age to purchase tobacco to 21).

Tobacco use impacts...

heart disease rates, infant mortality, and guality of life.

Increase in heart disease death for ages 35-54

Decrease in infant deaths

Although lower than the state average, the heart disease mortality rate among Lorain County residents ages 35-54 years is trending in the wrong direction.

> To help make it easy for residents to stay active and reduce heart disease, LCPH teamed up with partners to offer free fitness in 113 locations. 73% of those are in underserved areas.

More action in 2019:

- Administered 9.160 vaccines
- Distributed 350 Cribs for Kids
- Screened 11.981 students' vision
- Screened 10,514 students' hearing
- Served 7,472 WIC clients

- In 2019, fewer babies died before their first birthday. African American infant deaths in Lorain County have decreased by about 50% since 2011.
- To help give babies a healthy start, LCPH secured a \$134,000 grant in 2019 for Mercy Health Resource Mothers, a program that connects new moms with community health workers (CHWs). CHWs guide new families through pregnancy and a baby's first year.

Reached 11,885 community members at health fairs

Licensed 1.574 food facilities

Investigated 459 animal bites

Inspected 38 body art facilities

Collected 405 beach water samples



Tire dumps provide an ideal breeding site for mosquitoes, which can infect humans with diseases like West Nile Virus and La Crosse Encephalitis. LCPH monitors and treats mosquito breeding sites throughout the season.

- > 290 tons of tires removed from a single dump
- ► 5 dump sites identified for cleanup
- > 100,000 tires at the largest dump site (that would cover 13 football fields!)

Promoting families & farmers

In the summer of 2019, WIC distributed farm market vouchers to pregnant and breastfeeding WIC clients and to WIC families with children in the program. A family that chose to receive the vouchers got 4 coupons worth \$5 each to use at local WIC-approved produce stands.

- ► 303 vouchers redeemed
- ► \$1,515 spent on local farmers' healthy food
- > 2 farmers + 1 farm market participated

Protecting all people

Lorain County is a unique community with diverse and sometimes hard-to-reach populations. LCPH strives to protect all of Lorain County by using data, evidencebased best practices, and community input to reach out to unique populations.

- ► 425 rural residents educated on new septic system operation and maintenance requirements
- ➤ 345 individuals screened for HIV
- ► 1,800 handwashing signs distributed in English and Spanish
- ► Over 1,400 food facilities inspected
